the children, issue of the marriage between the Petitioner and the Respondent, do remain in the custody of the Petitioner until further order of the Court, but it is directed that such children be not removed out of the jurisdiction of the Court without its sanction.

And it is further ordered that the Petitioner do pay to the Respondent her taxed costs, not to exceed the amount ordered to be paid into Court or secured for the Wife's costs of hearing.

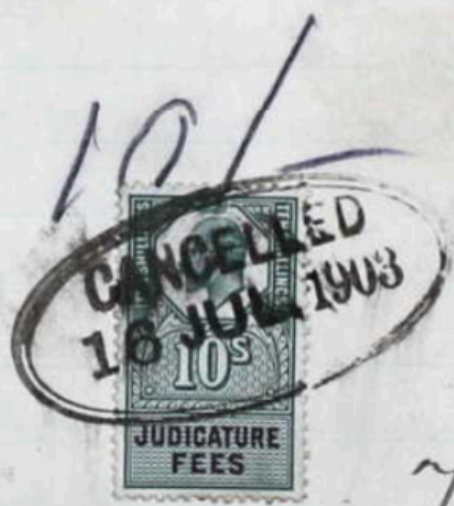

1. That on the 27th day of October 1888 at All Saints
Church in the Parish of Clapton in the County of
Middlesex your Petitioner (then Emily Wright
spinster) was lawfully married to the said
Arthur Edmund Burgum.
2. That after her said Marriage your Petitioner lived
and co-habited with her said husband at 55
Glenam Road Clapton and at 9 Elderfield
Road Clapton both in the County of Middlesex

and that there was issue of the said marriage
one child and no more viz:- Miriam Ivy
Burgum born on the 25th day of June 1891
and which child is now in the custody of your
Petitioner
3. That the said Arthur Edmund Burgum whilst
living with your Petitioner at 9 Elderfield Road
Clapton in the County of Middlesex in the month
of July 1890 without reasonable excuse deserted
your Petitioner and from that time has deserted
your Petitioner for two years and upwards to the
present time.

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays that your Lordship will be pleased to decree that the said Marriage of your Petitioner with the said Arthur Edmund Burgum be dissolved; that your Petitioner may have the custody of the said Abriam Ivy the child of the said marriage and that your Petitioner may have such further and other relief in the premises as to your Lordship may seem meet

By the Act of 6 & 7 William IV, c. 86, sec. 38, it is enacted, "That the Registrar-General shall cause to be made a Seal of the said Registrar-Office, and the Registrar-General shall cause to be made or stamped thereon all Certified Copies of Entries given in the said Office; and all Certified Copies of Entries, purporting to be Sealed or Stamped with the Seal of the said Registrar-Office, shall be received as evidence of the Birth, Death, or Marriage to which the same relate, without any further or other proof of such Entry; and no Certified Copy purporting to be given in the said Office shall be of any force or effect which is not sealed or stamped as aforesaid."

By sec. 37 of the same Act, it is enacted that, "for every general search of the Indexes shall be paid the sum of *twenty shillings*, and for every particular search the sum of *one shilling*, and for every Certified Copy the sum of *two shillings and sixpence* exclusive of Inland Revenue Stamp (33 & 34 Vict., c. 97) of one penny."

The Act 24 & 25 Vict., c. 98, sec. 36, enacts that, "whosoever shall unlawfully destroy, deface, or injure, or cause or permit to be destroyed, defaced, or injured, any Register of Births, Baptisms, Marriages, Deaths, or Burials, or any Certified Copy of any such Register, or shall forge or fraudulently alter in any such Register any Entry relating to any Birth, Baptism, Marriage, Death, or Burial, or any Certified Copy of such Register, or of any part thereof, or shall forge or counterfeits the Seal of or belonging to any Registry Office, or shall offer, utter, dispose of, or put off any such Register, Entry, Certified Copy, Certificate, or Seal, knowing the same to be false, forged, or altered, shall be guilty of Felony, and be liable to Penal Servitude, or to Imprisonment with Hard Labour."
