and Virtue of an and every Authority in me being do
make this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby
give devise and bequeath limit direct and appoint all
my freehold and leasehold Estates whatsoever of
which I have any disposing Power to my said Husband
Henry Burgum and his assigns for and during the Term of
his natural life and from and immediately after his Decease
unto my son Henry Burgum and my Daughter Mary
either their heirs Ex^{ts} and assigns share and share
alike as Tenants in common and not as joint Tenants but
if either of them shall dye under the age of twenty one year
and unmarried then I give the share of him or her so dying
to the Survivor of them his or her heirs Ex^{ts} and assigns

And lastly I make and constitute my said Husband Henry
Burgum sole Executor thereof in witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this 11th Day of May 1764
The Mark of Martha Burgum - signed sealed published and
declared by the said Martha Burgum as and for her last
Will and Testament in the presence of us who have attested
the same in her sight at her request and in the presence
and sight of each other - Christiana Barber Wife of Sampson
Barber Esq^r - Robert Lancaster servant to Mr. Burgum -
Mr. Thos. Standen.

This Will was proved at London the sixth Day of
September in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
and sixty four before the Right Worshipful George Bay Porter
of Laws Master Keeper or Commissary of the prerogative Court
of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oath of Henry Burgum
the Husband of the deceased and sole Executor named in
the said Will to whom Administration was granted of all and
singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased he
having been first sworn by Commission duly to administer /s/ G. B.
